Príncipal's Message...

North Guwahati happens to be a very ancient and historical place in Assam. It is situated on the northern bank of the river Brahmaputra. It used to be the capital city of ancient Kamrup. The landmark historical battle of Saraighat, fought between the Ahoms and the Mughals, took place near this place. This place has always been blessed by pristine natural beauty and the mighty river Brahmaputra has always been its lifeline.

Apart from its rich historical past, the place also boasts of being the birthplace of many renowned scholars including Anundoram Barooah, Karmavir Nabin Chandra Bordoloi, Bolinarayan Borah, Col. Shivram Borah and many more.

North Gauhati College came into being on 4th September, 1962. It was the only institution of higher education in the entire North Kamrup (old Kamrup) District during that period. It used to cater to the needs of a vast number of students in the field of higher education in this vastly populated area. The college has come a long way since then. It is now an institution with more than 2000 students. Its reach and bound has spread to newer areas, and presently, a good number of students from places like Guwahati, Rangia, Baihata Chariali, Bezera, Mandakata, Pati Darrang, Goreswar, Naokata, Bholajhar, Changsari, Borka, Hajo, Sualkuchi of Kamrup district and Kurua, Khalihai, Kalitapara, Dumunichowki, Sipajhar, Mangaldai, Orang, etc. of Darrang district come to study in our college. The college is well connected by roadways, (buses, tempos, Tata Magic, E-rickshaws, etc.) as well as riverways (ferry service). Moreover, the construction of a ropeway connecting Guwahati and North Guwahati was completed in 2020 and is now fully functional. The construction of another bridge connecting Guwahati and North Guwahati is underway and this will definitely give new dimensions to the college. The college is affiliated to Gauhati University and has fullfledged streams of Arts and Science. Apart from that, the college has been running a B. Voc course under UGC and programmes under IGNOU and KKHSOU. In 2019, UGCBCS programme were started as per UGC guideline to enable students to study what [s]he prefers in his/ her own sequence as per his/ her interest, with an aim to redefine the curriculum in keeping pace with the liberalisation and globalisation in education.

The students have been performing well in the university examinations continuously. Apart from academics, many students have brought laurels to the college by way of participating in various games, sports and socio-cultural activities.

Covid-19 has impacted the teaching-learning situation and the college has devised strategies to make online learning accessible to students. The college website now has provisions not only for conducting online classes, but also for accessing study materials, online examinations, online submission of assignments and online recording of attendance so as to make continuous evaluation possible. The college has also conducted an assortment of activities virtually (Webinars, Environment day celebration, Quiz etc.) during the lockdown period receiving phenomenal response from teachers and students.

The college has already completed and celebrated its Golden Jubilee in the year 2012. The college has been untiringly trying to upgrade the infrastructure and other teaching-learning resources with the help of all concerned organisations. The aim of North Gauhati College is to be counted amongst the top 10 colleges of the state in all frontiers within a period of ten years.

As per the guidelines of Gauhati University, North Gauhati College has been offering CBCS system for B.A. & B. Sc. Courses from the 2019- 2020 session. According to the UGC-CBCS system, the programmes that were earlier known as Major Course and General course have now been renamed as Honours Course and Regular Course respectively. In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorised into Core Course, Elective Course and Ability Enhancement Course.

- 1. The Core Course is compulsory for both Honours and Regular Courses.
- 2. Elective Courses can be chosen from subjects available in the college. It is of two types
 - a. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE)
 - b. Generic Elective (GE) (May not be related to discipline)
- 3. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC). It is of two types
 - a. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC)
 - b. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)

In order to guide students in choosing their subject combinations, Programme Templates have been provided. These Templates have been prepared in accordance to the GU UGC-CBCS guidelines.

VOCATIONAL COURSES:

North Gauhati College has been offering three year (six semesters) Bachelor Degree Course in Vocational Studies (B.Voc.) since 2015 in collaboration with the National Skills Development Council (NSDC). The college offers a course in **Tourism and Hospitality Management.** The B.Voc Degree is recognised by UGC and is affiliated to Gauhati University. A special feature of the course is that there are multiple exit points. Here, a student who opts to leave the course at the end of the first year is awarded a Diploma, a student who opts to exit at the end of two years is awarded an Advanced Diploma, and upon completing three years, one is awarded the B. Voc Degree. The course has earned wide popularity among students due to the fact that the central and the state governments have laid much emphasis on skills development in their recent policies.

The college has a separate campus for B. Voc. with well-equipped classrooms computer laboratory, and other infrastructural facilities. The placement records of students pursuing this course have been quite satisfactory. The department has trained and qualified faculty members appointed both on regular and part time basis. Tourism and Hospitality department has Radisson Blu, Shivani Aviates, GNRC as industry partners.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

The Academic procedure is conducted according to the directions of H.S. Council and Gauhati University. All form fill-ups will be done through online mode only. Forms for admission will be made available on the college website. Admissions will strictly be done on

the basis of merit, supplemented by the parameters decided by the college authority. The decisions of the Admission Committee regarding admission are final. Any pressure or interference from any quarter for admission of a particular student will result in forfeiture of the claim. All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of the AHSEC/G.U. The college will not be responsible if AHSEC/GU does not approve of the admission of any student on grounds like lacking migration certificate, eligibility criteria, or for furnishing wrong or false documents, etc. On the day of admission, candidates are required to produce **ORIGINAL** documents along with one set of Photostat copy (date and time of admission to be notified on the college website). The list of documents to be produced is given below:

- A) Mark sheet(s) and Certificate(s) of the last qualifying examination(s).
- B) Age certificate.
- C) Character certificate.
- D) Caste certificate, if applicable.
- E) Income certificate, if applicable.

Students who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a <u>Gap Certificate</u> from the Head of the institution last attended or a Gazetted officer testifying his/her activities during the interim period. All candidates must submit attested copies of all the documents mentioned above at the time of submission of admission form. Students belonging to SC, ST (P), ST ((H), OBC and MOBC categories must also submit attested copy of the certificate from the competent authority.

Fee Structure:

The admission fee structure will be decided as per Government regulations and will be notified on the college website.

Reservation:

The provisions for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, MOBC and Specially-abled categories are in accordance with the rules of the State Government. Students opting to avail reservation facilities will have to produce relevant certificates and other corroborating documents from competent authorities. In both H.s. 1st year and TDC 1st year, 10 seats are reserved for students having records of outstanding performance in sports, cultural activities, NCC and others. Employee quota provision is also applicable for admission. Requisite documents have to be submitted by the students along with the application form.

GENERAL RULES:

The college emphasizes on fostering discipline and character building amongst students. Students admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority. The Discipline Committee oversees and ensures that

there is no breach of regulations, and investigates and takes necessary steps if breaches are noticed and/or reported. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress in academics, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college dues, showing discourtesy to any member of the college fraternity in any forms, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which may lead to termination of scholarships and even expulsion from the college. Any form of ragging in the college campus is strictly prohibited. The courses of study in the College are full time courses. No students can take any other full time course simultaneously in and outside the institution. Students' societies and associations shall have to abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college administration. Only those societies and associations recognized by the Head of the Institution shall have the facilities of the college premises. Any notice desired to be circulated by the students anywhere in the college will need the prior approval of the college authority. The decision of the Discipline Committee shall be final in all matters pertaining to the upholding of discipline. Tobacco, alcohol and any other kind of substance abuse in any form is prohibited in the campus. It is mandatory for all students to wear the college uniform and Identity Card within the college campus.

Examination Rules:

The Examination Cell of the college conducts all examinations. The Cell follows the guidelines received from Gauhati University for Undergraduate courses and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council for Higher Secondary courses. It strictly adheres to college examination and promotion rules.

Selection Procedure for Honours course:

Selection of the students for Honours Course is done completely on the basis of merit. A student should write the name of the subject [s]he intends to opt for as Honours and Regular course in the Admission Form, selecting from the combinations given in the **Prospectus**. Students who opt for Honours course have to mention **three subjects on the basis of preference** and name three subjects which [s]he wishes to opt as general subjects in accordance to her/ his preference. Admission in Honours Course will be given on the same day of the general admission after conducting a scrutiny by the concerned departments on the basis of merit.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:

Uniform: Uniform is mandatory for every student while in college and while representing the college in any platform. The uniform dress code is as follows:

For Boys: Trouser & Shirt (Formal), of prescribed colour. Low waist pants, jeans trousers and short shirts with different colours are not allowed.

For Girls: Salwar-Kameez with Dupatta of prescribed colour. Churi /Leggings, low-cut neck and High neck kameez are not allowed.





Identity Card: Identity cards will be provided by the college. It is mandatory for students to carry their Identity Cards to college and while participating in any programme outside on behalf of the college. Identity cards must be properly signed by the principal.

Attendance: 75% attendance in all subjects is compulsory for students to appear in final examinations. The students must submit their percentage of attendance at office during the time of filling up of their Examination forms. They are to collect their percentage of attendance from their respective Departments, duly signed by the HOD.

Substance Abuse: Strict action will be taken against a student if [s]he is found smoking, drinking alcoholic beverages, chewing tobacco or indulging in any kind of substance abuse within the college campus.

Ragging and Anti-Social Activities: Any form of ragging in the college campus is strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken if anyone is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging and in any other kind of ant-social activities.

Cleanliness: Students are expected to cooperate in keeping the classrooms and campus of the college clean. Dustbins for bio-degradable wastes and non-biodegradable wastes are provided for maintaining the cleanliness in the institution.

COLLEGE ADMINISTRATION

The Principal of the college is in charge, and holds the administrative responsibility. The Governing Body of the institution oversees pertinent issues, and makes necessary recommendations. Instructions and directions from the Higher Education, Gauhati University, AHSEC are followed and executed for smooth conduct of the administration. Members of the staff help in execution and functioning of the mechanism.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The North Gauhati College Library is rapidly growing to be one of the leading regional level academic libraries in the north bank of Brahmaputra. The library was established way back in 1962. There are separate reading rooms for students and teachers. The documents in the library are well arranged. The library is well equipped with a good number of text books, reference materials, xerox facilities, internet with fully open access facilities automated with the help of library oriented software SOUL 2.08 (software for university library) network version. All bibliographic details of books, journals and CDROM databases are accessible through the computer. It has a good number of journals (National and International) and magazines. Besides these, the different national and local newspapers (daily and weekly) are available to the user community. North Gauhati College library adequately caters to the needs of the students and teaching community. It offers an environment conducive to learning and for intellectual enquiry by providing user focused services to obtain and access scholarly information and knowledge. The library remains open from 10 am to 4 pm on all working days. It offers essential and specialized information, resources and services to meet the growing information needs by-

- Developing user based resources
- Organizing information resources
- Providing human and technology moderated access to information
- Facilitating users to identify, locate, obtain and access information

Every department has its own library where sufficient numbers of books related to the courses of study are available.

Services

The main service in the college library is book lending. Books and journals are purchased as per the requirement of the students and teachers. Basically the following services are provided to the users of the North Gauhati College Library –

- Lending service

- Bibliographic instruction
- Assistance in the searching documents or understanding of reference books etc.
- Reader's advisory service

ADD ON FACILITIES:

Hostel: A Girls' hostel has been constructed in the college campus, with the financial assistance of UGC. It has been functional since August 2015. The accommodation capacity of the hostel is 24. Students have to fill up separate admission form in order to apply for hostel seat.

Automatic Weather Station: The College has installed an Automatic Weather Station (AWS) sponsored by Assam Science and Technology and Environmental Council. Students, teachers, researcher, officials and general public can access data related to climate and weather of this locality through this station.

NCC: The College has N.C.C. units for both boys and girls in separate wings. A candidate can enroll as a cadet after filling up the required forms available with the teacher in charge concerned. A substantial number of NCC cadets have scaled great heights. The mission of Senior Division (SD) NCC platoon is to build the students up as responsible citizens with adequate knowledge of discipline, self-defence training, knowledge about disaster management, social responsibilities etc.

NSS: The College has an NSS cell. A candidate can enrol as a volunteer by filling up required form available with the Programme Officer of the College. The NSS programme officer is selected from amongst the teaching faculty. Every year, the enrolment drive programme for NSS student volunteers is organised in the month of August at the college campus when the session begins. Along with the regular activities, the volunteers actively participate in different activities.

The highlight of the programmes of 2015-16 is the workshop on law as a career option where our HS student Ms. Dikhita Bora got selected for free coaching facilities. She has qualified the all India level CLAT (Common Law Admission Test) and is

pursuing it in NLUJA (National Law University and Judicial Academy), Assam. She has also been selected for receiving five years of free education with all facilities.

Yoga Cell: Yoga cell was established in August 2014 with members from both the students and teaching faculty of the college. The main objective of the cell is to make students and people of the area aware of the importance of Yoga not only as a man-making, nation-building instrument but also as a tool for international peace, harmony and unity. The cell organizes training programmes on Yoga, Pranayama, Meditation as well as lectures and popular talks.

Red Ribbon Club: The club was formed in June, 2015 with a nodal officer and members from teaching faculty and students. ACADEMIC MACHINERIES

IQAC: The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) sets parameters for achievement and maintenance of quality in the college. Various committees are formed under the IQAC for smooth functioning and growth of the college.
